What is the social economy?

The social economy includes organizations with a social mission: they create jobs and purchase goods and services, but emphasize social goals. Among social economy organizations are nonprofits, co-operatives, credit unions, social enterprises, foundations, and mutual associations that serve a membership. Their primary focus is people rather than money as in a typical business


